



#### **REGISTRATION AND ENROLLMENT**

Parents and guardians will submit registration applications in our online form or at TAF. Once the form is submitted, parents and guardians will be notified that their application was received. Two weeks prior to the class start date, registration applications will be compiled and students will be enrolled.

Enrollment priority is based on: whether the student has taken ASAP classes before, past attendance (if the student has taken ASAP classes), and whether the student is on a free or reduced lunch program. Parents and guardians will be notified whether the student has been enrolled or waitlisted two weeks prior to the class start date.
