REGISTRATION AND ENROLLMENT

Parents and guardians will submit registration applications in our online form or at TAF. Once the form is submitted, parents and guardians will be notified that their application was received. Two weeks prior to the class start date, registration applications will be compiled and students will be enrolled. Enrollment priority is based on: whether the student has taken ASAP classes before, past attendance (if the student has taken ASAP classes), and whether the student is on a free or reduced lunch program. Parents and guardians will be notified whether the student has been enrolled or waitlisted two weeks prior to the class start date.



The Tippecanoe Arts Federation's After School Arts Program (ASAP) is open and free to all. ASAP is designed to make a meaningful difference in the lives of youth in our community. Most classes meet at the Tippecanoe Arts Federation. Use the West entrance off the TAF parking lot, located off 6th street; classes are held in the first floor rooms. Advanced registration is required and students are enrolled on a first-come, first-serve basis with preference paid to first-time program participants. Early enrollment is strongly encouraged. **Students and guardians are required to commit to the program by attending ALL sessions of the class in which they enroll. Please call TAF at 765-423-2787 if the student is unable to attend or will be late for class.**

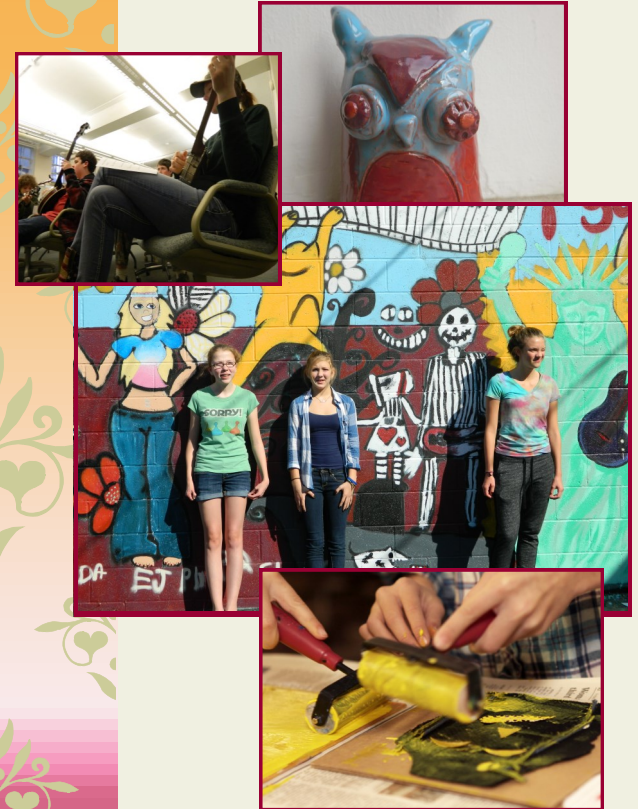
ASAP follows the Lafayette School Corporation's school calendar and weather-related closings. Make-up classes are scheduled when possible.
