LSO also presents free education-outreach programs to area schools, including 2 programs for 4th graders, and a free Family Lollipop Concert in February.

Thanks to a Museums for America Grant from the Institute for Museum and Library Services, in collaboration with the Indianapolis Children's Museum and Purdue University, the Art Museum of Greater Lafayette has updated Art Smart: Indiana. Orginally, Art Smart: Indiana was developed as an outreach program by the Art Museum in 1986 to teach Indiana history through artwork created by Indiana artists. Slide presentations by museum docents in individual classrooms are now achieved by our www.artsmartindiana.org, resource catalogs, and teaching The result is a more accessible program for Indiana teachers and students alike that will appeal to a broad statewide audience. The Museum offers exhibitions and additional educational programming year-round including gallery talks, summer art camps, docent-led school group tours, and studio art classes for children and adults. The Art Museum is accredited by the American Association of Museums, an honor shored by no other museum in the region.
