"Reading to the Dogs" January 29 and/or February 12 / 2pm

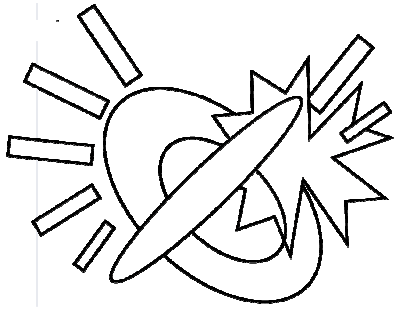
